ILACP Priority Legislative Bills Spring 2023

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This document is designed to assist you when speaking with local legislators. This is a fluid document that may change as bills move or are amended in the legislative process. Each bill number contains a link to the full bill on **ilga.gov**

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Top Priority Bills- * Denotes ILACP bill or initiative.

- I. <u>HB 1552</u> Oppose Would allow for a petition to be filed that could cause a police officer active <u>or</u> retired to lose their retirement benefits/pension. Removes survivor benefits as well. (Re-referred to Rules Comm.)
- *HB 3379 Support Provides additional options for the appropriate use of less lethal tools. (Re-referred to Rules Comm.)
- 3. *HB 3815 Support Clearly defines "in uniform" and who has to wear BWCs. Sunsets notification clause in 2026; modifies FOIA and annual reporting requirements, among other changes. (Re-referred to Rules Comm.)
- 4. *SB 0107- Support Drones as first responders bill. Expands usage to include public events. (Also, HB 1228, HB 2951, SB 1455, SB 1788, SB 1983) (Senate Assigned to Executive Comm.)
- 5. <u>HB 3038</u> **Oppose** Provides that neither a law enforcement entity nor the Illinois State Police shall report the seizure, forfeiture, or receipt of property subject to reporting under federal law through equitable sharing agreements with the federal government. Greatly expands asset forfeiture-mandated reporting categories. (**Referred to Rules Comm.**)
- 6. *SB 1459 Support ALPR system data act. (3/3 Senate to Executive Subcommittee on Special Issues)
- 7. <u>HB 3326</u> Oppose Restricts sharing of ALPR data to any state that has enacted laws that deny or interfere with a woman's right to choose or obtain an abortion. (Referred to Rules Committee)
- HB 3114 Oppose Changes definition of "supervisor" in police units allowing circumventing LBR allowing for easier organizing of shift/watch commanders. Directly affects HB3115. (3/9 Placed on Calendar 2nd Reading -Short Debate)
- HB 3115 Oppose Creates the Police Promotion Act. Limits appointed positions, mandates certain elements and requirements for sheriff and municipal promotional testing while limiting home rule. Eliminates appointed positions by making ranks above those in bargaining units tested positions. Numerous merit point requirements. (3/9 House placed on calendar 2nd reading Short debate)

Priority Bills

- HB 1089 Oppose Peace Officer Accountability. Requires officers to have liability insurance, residency requirements, 20 hours of annual race relations training, additional academy training among other requirements. (Re-referred to Rules Comm.)
- 2. <u>HB 1206</u> Oppose Removes "odor-proof" from the container requirements for cannabis in vehicles. (Re-referred to Rules Comm.)
- 3. <u>HB 1208</u>, <u>SB 0217</u> **Support** Making up deficiencies in the payment of claims in regard to the Line of Duty Compensation Act. **(Re-referred to Rules Comm.)**
- 4. *HB 1433 Support Eliminates the sunset of the officer safety overhear exemption (makes permanent) from

eavesdropping involving a conversation in which a law enforcement officer, or any person acting at the direction of a law enforcement officer, is a party and has given consent. (Re-referred to Rules Comm.)

- 5. <u>HB 1542</u> Support Appropriates \$80 million to ILETSB for deposit into the Law Enforcement Camera Grant Fund for BWCs. (Referred to Rules Comm.)
- 6. <u>HB 2246</u>, <u>SB 2329</u> **Support** Expands Highway Camera System Program state-wide (versus designated counties) and provides funds for installation and maintenance of cameras (ALPRs), telecommunications costs, data storage costs, and for camera warranties. (3/8 House placed on calendar 2nd reading Short debate)
- 7. <u>HB 3213</u> **Support** Codifies existing common law that a local governmental entity and its employees owe a duty of care to the public at large, therefore it does not owe a duty of care to individual members of the public to provide governmental services. (**Referred to Rules Comm.**)
- 8. *HB 3816 Support Provides that ILETSB shall establish a system for the development, delivery, and tracking of in-service training courses and can designate any training to be delivered electronically. Give ILETSB the authority to determine annual in-service training requirements and limits those requirements to 40-hours over three years. (Re-referred to Rules Comm.)
- 9. SB 0333 Oppose- Delays reporting of sexual assault by medical personnel. Limits information provided to LE. (Senate placed on calendar order of 3rd reading 3/21)
- 10. *SB 1808 Support Permits municipal use of utility poles for public safety equipment. (Referred to Assignments)
- I I. <u>SB 1830</u> Oppose Allows for the expungement of various felony controlled substances violations. Reduces the penalties for the knowing manufacture or delivery, possession with intent to manufacture or deliver, or possession of certain specified controlled substances. Reduces the penalties for the knowing possession of certain specified controlled substances. (Rereferred to Assignments)
- 12. *SB 1807, HB 1276 Support Makes fleeing and eluding a felony in all cases and enhances penalty for aggravated fleeing and eluding. (Senate Assigned to Subcommittee on CLEAR Compliance)
- 13. *SB 1870 Support Expands residential burglary to include entering on the property or another to commit the theft of a motor vehicle. (Re-referred to Rules Comm.)
- 14. <u>SB 1769</u> Oppose- Requires all vehicles purchased or leased after 1/1/25 by a government unit to be zero emissions vehicles or converted to zero-emissions vehicles. (3/9 Senate placed on calendar order of 2nd reading)

Other Bills of Concern

- I. <u>HB 1136</u> Oppose Crime and Accident scene photos. Should apply to everyone and not just law enforcement. (Re-referred to Rules Comm.)
- 2. <u>HB 3322</u> Oppose Creates the Law Enforcement Gang Database Information Act. Evidence of a person on a gang database is not admissible. (3/8 House placed on calendar 2nd reading Short debate)
- 3. <u>HB 3444</u> Oppose Special considerations and diminished culpability for those under the age of 26. (Referred to Rules Comm.)
- 4. <u>HB 3751</u> Oppose Allows non-citizens, authorized to work in U.S., to apply to be municipal police officers. (3/9 House placed on calendar 2nd reading Short debate
- 5. <u>SB 0065</u> Oppose Allows municipalities to opt out of pension funds for police/fire if population under 5,000. (Re-referred to Assignments)
- 6. SB 1768 Oppose Requires chiefs of police to be elected. (Referred to Assignments)
