In addition, he has provided executive protection for numerous captains of industry, VIPs and celebrities throughout his esteemed career.

Upon getting the news about this award, Doria said, “In today’s turbulent times, the entire public safety community must come together to complement, enhance and embrace a productive and permanent partnership. Both public and private sectors must fulfill higher and larger purposes by contributing to a safer world through mutual aid, training and shared resources.”

Prior to joining P4 Global and The Protection Group, Doria was vice president of Business Development and area vice president for Securitas Security

Services USA, the leader in integrated guarding services in the United States. Doria's responsibilities included the growth of Securitas within the Chicagoland area.

Hayes said the Illinois police chiefs recognize that Doria has strived to raise standards within the security industry and that he once administered a workforce of thousands of security and off-duty law enforcement officers. "He is highly regarded by his own colleagues and by leaders in law enforcement," Hayes said, praising Doria's service on the Illinois Association of Chiefs of Police Public/Private Liaison Committee.

Doria was an active member of the ASIS Law Enforcement Liaison Council and Private Security Council. He is a co-founder and former President of the Midwest Security Conference; a co-founder, former vice president and current advisory board member of the Illinois State Crime Commission; and a former chairman of the DuPage County Crime Commission.

Doria will be honored formally by the Illinois chiefs at their Annual Awards Banquet on Saturday, June 13, at the Westin Chicago North Shore hotel in Wheeling.
